Vale: Don Marsh 1934-2021

Don Marsh was a founding member of Friends of the Organ Pipes, formed in 1972 and the first of many environmental Friends groups in Victoria. Don, Barry Kemp, and others pioneered the re-establishment of native vegetation using locally indigenous seed and setting up planting zones.

Pat and Holt Pettit worked with Don on the Maribyrnong Valley Committee and were inspired by his example to establish Friends of the Maribyrnong Valley. Don was a Life Member of our group.

Dons' active involvement in FOOPs was tragically cut short in 1989 by a cycling accident which left him severely disabled. However, he maintained his interest and enthusiasm for restoring the environment, particularly at Organ Pipes but also the whole of the valley and continued to be an inspiration to the following generations of FOOPs members.

Children under 16 years of age must be supervised by a responsible adult.



Sewer relining – MRM & MRR

MRM-NWS sewer connection project

Melbourne Water has recently awarded the contract for the Maribyrnong River Main (MRM) – North -West Sewer (NWS) connection project to install the new sewer pipe that will connect the two sewer mains from the Maribyrnong River (near the existing pipe bridge) in Avondale Heights to the North- West Sewer (near the corner of Hampstead and Williamson Roads) in Maidstone. Melbourne Water's contractor Safety Focused Performance Joint Venture (SFP) is currently carrying out detailed design for the project. A newsletter containing information about expected impacts and construction activity has recently been delivered to households in Maidstone and Ascot Vale. Sewer relining – MRM & MRR

Melbourne Water has also been working to complete the re-lining of the Maribyrnong River Main Sewer and its Reliever sewer. Stage 1 of this project, near Aberfeldie Park is almost finished. Stage 2 will start in January/ February 2022. Stage 2 involves relining 250 metres of the Maribyrnong River Reliever (MRR) which is a section of pipe that helps to remove and hold extra sewage flows from the MRM sewer, particularly during peak wet weather events. This section is located at Afton Street Conservation Reserve and includes rehabilitation of three manholes. A community bulletin to explain these works and timings will be delivered to residents early in the new year.
