This Quarter Events:

Much of this quarter has been devoted to maintenance of the large areas of planting carried out in the previous quarter. Our team of volunteers have been working on weeding, mulching and watering and guard removal where appropriate. We have had a lot of support from a volunteer group of international students and refugees who have attended many working bees with a young group of volunteers. We have

also held a number of corporate days with NAB which have been well attended. Finally, we have had had a couple of working bees with Maribyrnong College and Marian College.

Site Updates

• **Burndap Reserve** – Large areas have been planted out this year. We are now in the process of mulching these planting zone hopefully before the hot summer arrives. Nab have been particularly helpful in this task. As can be seen, many areas are still to be mulched



 Cranwell Park – In winter the entire slope down to the river has been planted out by contractors. Our group has done the guarding and we have now mulched about 60% of the area. Further along the path towards the Maidstone golf course, contractors are in the process of removing boxthorn from the steeper slopes.





 Burton Crescent – This site has been heavily planted over many days and is now being mulched. The success rate of the planting has been high with many plants now requiring guard removal. Maribyrnong College has helped with the planting and mulching on two occasions. We hope to have new mulch deliveries next week in order to complete mulching before Christmas.



Caroline Chisholm – Our only activity here was a planting event with Brimbank council in May. At
that time the site was still badly effected post flooding and the grass had been churned up by joy
riders. Since then the gates have been replaced and most of the tree debris removed which greatly
improved its appearance.



 History gardens (Pipemakers park) – This site has been a major focus of FMV this last quarter driven in no small part by Lorraine and Dalys. The garden was in a fairly sorry state, overgrown by weeds and grasses. However, after weeding and laying down weed block (cardboard/newspaper) followed by mulching has resulted in a great improvement in its appearance.

 AGM – This was held on 6th Sept at the Maribrynong Community centre. Our guest speaker was Lloyd O'Hanlon who currently works at the Melbourne Botanical gardens. He gave a well-received presentation on a remanent population of Callitris glaucophylla (White Cyprus) at two locations in the Maribyrnong defence site.

General News:

- Maribyrnong Trail Closure The trail remains 'closed' between Brimbank Park and Norths Road due to flood damage (since October last year) causing safety risks. Parks Victoria are in the process of documenting the damage to the trail in order to seek funds for its restoration from insurance. No time frame for final reopening is available at this time.
- Maribyrnong River Main (RMR) to Northwest Sewer connection project The planned Maribyrnong Trail closure near Canning Reserve expected early this year never eventuated. This was due to delays in the tunnelling process. The update from October showed the main shaft was complete and the first 200m of the eventual 800m tunnel had been bored.
